**SUBJECT: Electric Meter Box**

It has come to the Board's attention that Electric Meter Boxes need to be inspected and defective Boxes replaced.

Electric Meter Boxes and electric meters are attached to the outside of your Unit where the PECO power supply enter your Unit and are a homeowner responsibility.

We are informed by PECO that deterioration through aging and various other circumstances such as ground and building movement and settlement can cause the electrical connections contained inside the Electric Meter Box to be stressed or broken. Stressed or broken electrical connections in the Electric Meter Box are a fire hazard and Boxes containing fire hazard conditions should be replaced by a qualified electrician of the homeowner's choice. If you notice any unusual condition on the outside of your Electric Meter Box or hear any unusual sounds from the Box, call your electrician immediately. You should not touch or attempt to inspect your Electric Meter Box as touching a defective box could be dangerous. Inspection and replacement of Electric Meter Boxes are a homeowner expense.

Note that your Unit is one in a building containing several Units. A fire in one Unit could spread and cause serious damage to the entire building.

In the interest of the safety of our residents and the protection of their investments, we strongly urge you to have your Electric meter Box inspected by a qualified electrician of your choice and promptly replace any Electric Meter Box found to be defective. These inspections should be ongoing and performed periodically every few years.
