*The Landscape of Daylesford Lake*

We as the Community of Daylesford Lake are so lucky to be living in the beautiful Chester County region of Pennsylvania. Daylesford Lake's entire community constitutes over 37 acres. Including the lake we have 18 acres of lawn and a great diversity of trees which has greatly helped us when a certain variety became diseased. We have so many varieties which give interest during the four seasons. Specific evergreens including pine, Norway spruce, blue spruce, giant arborvitae and other species. Deciduous trees include dogwoods, ash, pin oak, maple, crabapple, weeping cherries, weeping willows, magnolia trees, river birch, and various varieties of pear trees and crepe myrtle. All these varieties provide shade in the summer and seasonal interest the spring and fall.

Watering Tips:

It is better to water shrubs, plants and flowers early in the morning.

A soaker hose is preferable for new plantings until they are established. Water deeply and thoroughly. Lawns and annuals concentrate their roots in the top 6" of soil; for perennials, shrubs and trees, it's the top 12". In heavy soil, it may take hours for water to percolate down 6-12". Use your finger or a shovel to check the progress.

Excessive watering of lawns during hot summer weather is not necessarily a good idea.

Lawns generally recover as weather cools down in late summer early fall. interest the spring and fall
